## Prosper offices to close for Christmas and New Year's holidays

PROSPER (December 16, 2011) To accommodate the chronological rarity of Christmas Day falling on a Sunday this year, Prosper Town Hall offices will be closed for a four-day weekend starting Dec. 23 and ending Dec. 26. Offices will reopen on Tuesday, Dec. 27, according to Mike Land, Town Manager.

New Year's Day also falls on a Sunday this year; however, the offices will only close on Monday, Jan. 2.

The Prosper Community Library will also operate on a holiday schedule. On Dec. 21 and 22, the library will be open from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. It will then close from Friday, Dec. 23 to Monday, Dec. 26. From Dec. 27 to Dec. 29, the hours of operation will continue on the holiday schedule of 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. The library will close for the New Year holiday on Dec. 30 and remain closed through Jan. 2. On Jan. 3, the library will revert to its regular schedule.

Notwithstanding the dates of the holidays, garbage collection in Prosper will not be affected. All routes will be completed on a normal schedule.

And, for those wishing to dispose of their Christmas tree, Public Works is once again collecting undecorated and unflocked trees at the usual drop-off point just south of Town Hall on Main Street from Dec. 30 to Jan. 15.

IESI, the Town's garbage collection contractor, will provide its monthly bulk pickup service on Saturday, Dec. 31. Pickup of bulk trash occurs only on a requested basis. Any resident wishing to have bulky items picked up must call at least 24 hours in advance of the pickup day. The number to call is (469) 452-8000.
